# Supporting your student's transition to 1st grade

## Reading & Writing

**Reading**: summer is a great time to instill the love of reading in your child.

- + Visit the library
- + Read books together
- + Listen to stories online
- + Listen to them read
- + Ask them to read to a sibling, pet, or stuffed animal
- + Practice writing letters & words

#### Math

Math: summer is a great time to practice basic math.

- + When you are in the car have them count by 1s, 2s, 5s, and 10s.
- + Ask them to identify numbers when you are out.
- + Ask them to do simple addition and subtraction in everyday situations.

#### **Social & Behavior Skills**

- + Treats others with respect
- + Accepts responsibility for own behavior
- + Listens to others when they are speaking
- + Shares toys and attention
- + Keeps hands to self
- + Plays well with others
- + Participates in group activities

#### **School Hours**

- Monday through Thursday 9:00am to 3:25pm
- Friday 9:00am to 2:10pm

• 1st bell rings at 8.55am and students head to their classroom.

#### **Arrival**

Students arrive by bus, walking, or parent drop off.

**Bus**: busses will drop students off in the back in the bus loop. We have para educators who will meet your child and supervise arrival. Please note that Transportation will reach out to you if your student is eligible for bus service.

**Walkers**: we have crossing guards stationed at key intersections along route to school.

Parent Drop-Off: starts at 8.40am, located in the front loop.

#### Dismissal

**Bus**: Busses will pick up students at the back loop. Para educators supervise student boarding.

**Walkers**: We have a walking line supervised by para crossing guards.

Parent (car) Pick-Up located in the front loop.

#### Attendance — what to do if...

- + My child is sick call the office to let us know ASAP. Do not send your child to school if they are sick
- + They need to leave early send a note with your student in the morning and call us when you arrive. The office will notify the teacher once you have arrived.
- + They are late we want your student to come to school even if they are late. When you arrive, please call the office and let us know you are here. We will then support getting your child to class.

## Attendance expectations

- + When your child is sick, they need to stay home.
- + If they are not sick, they need to attend school.
- + Any student who misses more than 10% of the school year due to absences is considered chronic. Chronic absences often lead to student struggling both academically and socially at school.
- + We will be tracking attendance daily; you will be notified if your child has an unexcused absence or if they are at the 10% threshold.
- + Vacations must be pre-arranged and only the first 5 days can be excused at the principal's discretion.
