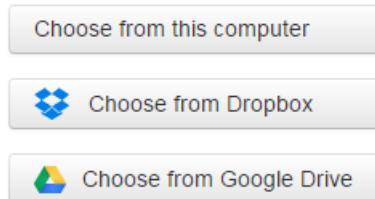


## Saving from Chromebook to TurnItIn.com

Here's how students submit their essays/presentations/etc. to TurnItIn.com using the Chromebooks. It's a little different than using a desktop or laptop because the Chromebooks don't allow saving to the device.

When having students use the preferred "Single File Upload" to submit (as opposed to the "copy and paste" field) to TurnItIn.com, they have these options:

Choose the file you want to upload to Turnitin:



Since students can't technically "Choose from this computer" in a traditional sense, as a Chromebook is not technically a computer, here are the options they have and how to do it:

1. They can use a thumb drive (easiest and most familiar to them all)
2. They can use Dropbox—though they would have to have a personal account, as this is not supplied through the district.
3. They can simply write their essay in GoogleDocs and submit that GoogleDoc from their GoogleDrive; this is district supported and very easy.
4. One option, if you don't want them to write with the GoogleDocs writing software but instead want them to use the Word in Office 365's OneDrive, then simply have them copy and paste that work into GoogleDocs once done and follow option 3 for submission.
5. **This is how to best use OneDrive's Word program and submit:** From their OneDrive "documents" section, they click on the document they want to submit TurnItIn.com, go the "More" option from the menu bar above, and choose "download." Please see the picture below. Then, when submitting to TurnItIn.com, they can choose "Choose from this computer" and the Chromebook will pop up a "Downloads" folder with the student's paper/presentation that was just downloaded from OneDrive. It works quickly and easily and requires no thumb drive.
