KAP: Kamiak After School Program

KAP: Math and Science

Monday-Thursday, 2:07-3:00 pm

Students receive assistance in completing or revising work, test taking, and study skills. Students are referred to KAP Math by a teacher, administrator, or counselor. A student can "self-refer" by talking to their math teacher.
