Who Can Ride the Bus?

School bus transportation is available to and from school for students who live within their school attendance area and who live more than the following distances from school:

- Elementary (K-5): at least one mile from school.
- Middle school (6-8): at least a mile and a half from school.
- High school (9-12): at least two miles from school.

Exceptions may be made for students with special needs or where walking may be hazardous. School bus route information is available on the school district’s transportation website. For more information, call 425-356-1306.

Meals

Breakfast and lunch are served at every school during the school year. To find out if your child will receive free meals at school, or should apply for free- or reduced-price meals, please visit the Nutrition Services website at <https://www.mukilteoschools.org/Domain/45>. Families can also view menus, meal prices and more at that website.

Family Access

Families can access their child’s student information using a feature called *Qmlativ Family and Student Access*. Using *Family Access*, parents can access student information details about their child, attendance records, health information, assessment results, schedule information, and other details concerning their child’s school record. Parents with children at the secondary level also can view their grade point average, transcript, as well as progress toward graduation. If you would like to have online access to your child’s records through *Family Access* and did not receive an email at the start of school, please contact your child’s school to establish your account and password.

Parent Notification System

The school district uses a family notification system called *ParentSquare* to send general announcements and urgent alerts to families. Depending on the urgency of the content, messages may be sent via telephone, text, and email about a child’s attendance, nutrition service balances, and library fines, as well as when school is canceled, or the start of school is delayed. This automated system uses the contact information that is listed in a child’s student records. Please make sure that your child’s school has accurate contact information for your child.

Board and School News

The school district sends bi-monthly newsletters to keep parents and community members informed about school board updates. To sign up, go to the district home page, go to the Our District tab, click on *Communications*. Schools also send newsletters to families, but there is no need to sign up. Authorized family members automatically receive communications through the family notification system.

School Closures or Delays

Weather conditions or other events may cause school to be canceled or delayed. Bus routes may also be affected by unsafe travel conditions. If school is canceled, the school day will be made up later in the year. Here are some ways you can get informed if school is canceled or the start of school is delayed:

- Receive notices through the parent notification system.
- Watch or listen to local TV and radio stations. Most major radio and television stations will broadcast information about school closures and delays.
- Follow the district Facebook, Instagram or Twitter pages.
- Check the school district’s website at www.mukilteoschools.org.

Unplanned Early Dismissal

Conditions could develop during the school day that may require school to be dismissed earlier than planned. Information about early dismissals will be distributed through the school district’s parent notification system. If school is dismissed early, and transportation home is not available, a child will be released only to his or her parent or guardian or to a person previously authorized by the parent or guardian. We ask that parents please bring photo identification (such as a driver’s license) to ensure student safety. School staff will remain at the school until all students have been released.

Contact Information

School staff members may need to contact you in the event of an emergency. The school needs the emergency contact information (address and daytime phone number) of each parent or guardian, as well as the phone numbers of two alternate emergency contacts. Be sure that your child’s records are kept current. If any contact information changes, please notify your child’s school.

Limited Transportation Routes

The school district may operate transportation on designated limited routes when there are unsafe travel conditions due to weather. The district will notify families if limited routes have been declared. Specific details about pick-up locations for limited routes are distributed to bus riders in the fall and will be available on the district’s transportation website.

Emergency Information

Each school has a plan for responding to emergencies and for providing information to parents. Please remember that communicating can become very difficult during an emergency. Phone service may be unavailable for outgoing or incoming calls to your child’s school. The school district will also use text messages, social media and TV and media outlets to reach families.

Lockdowns

A lockdown is used to protect students if there is a situation outside the school building or classroom that might threaten student safety. During a lockdown, students will be kept in their classrooms until the situation has been resolved. For the safety of all involved, you should not go to the school or attempt to remove your child from school while a building is in a lock-down situation.

Shelter-in-place

Shelter-in-place is an emergency response tool to protect students in the event of potential exposure to a hazardous contaminant in the atmosphere. If an airborne contaminant poses a threat to students during the school day, students and staff will remain indoors and the heating and ventilation system will be shut off, which creates a neutral atmosphere pressure in the building that forms a protective barrier against the contaminant. During a shelter-in-place incident, people will not be allowed in or out of the school building until the all-clear signal is given.

Family/Student Reunification

If weather or an emergency situation occurs which requires students to be picked up at a different time of day or at a different location than usual, a process will be established so that parents or guardians can take their child home. Parents or guardians should bring photo identification (such as a driver’s license) to ensure staff release students to an authorized guardian.

SafeSchools Alert

To help safeguard the school community, a tip reporting service allows students, staff, parents, and members of the community to submit safety concerns by telephone, text, email or online. Called *SafeSchools Alert*, the system can be used to report tips on bullying, harassment, drugs, vandalism, or any other kind of safety issue. Those calling to report an emergency will be advised to call 9-1-1, instead. A person with a concern can submit a tip in any of four ways:
